

Jane Austen in the 21st Century



Uvod

Povodom 200 godina smrti Jane Austen, u galeriji Anima u SŠ Ban Josip Jelačić Zprešić, 25. travnja 2018. godine otvorena je izložba Jane Austen in the 21st Century kao kruna cjelogodišnjeg projekta. Svi su posjetitelji mogli osjetiti dašak 19. stoljeća uz romantičnu glazbu, interijer, engleski čaj i kolačice te sveprisutne Jane. Izložba je zamišljena kao spoj tradicionalnog i modernog u sklopu Erasmus + projekta Nastava 21. stoljeća te kao dio projekta Zdravi odnosi kojim se potiče bolja suradnja učenika, djelatnika škole, roditelja i lokalne zajednice. Pod mentorstvom svojih profesorica Keti Bradanović (likovna kultura), Helge Kraljik (engleski jezik) i Ankice Šarić (engleski jezik), učenici svih usmjerenja i svih razreda pripremali su izložbu tijekom 2017./2018. školske godine. Pridružili su im se mnogi nastavnici i djelatnici škole kao i neki roditelji. Učenici su najprije proučavali život i djelo poznate engleske književnica te su se nakon toga nastavili likovno izražavati u različitim tehnikama. Budući da pripadamo digitalnom vremenu, ta ista likovna djela upotrebljena su u izradi online postera, infografika, stripova, puzli i bookmarkera uz pomoć različitih online alata. Učenici su također gledali filmove temeljene na djelima Jane Austen (Pride and Prejudice; Emma) te nakon toga izradili svoje voiceovere kao parodije filmskih isječaka. Također su osmislili i snimili intervju s Jane Austen koju su za potrebe snimanja intervjuja IT programom doveli u 21. stoljeće.

Samo otvaranje izložbe također su vodili učenici te na zanimljiv način potaknuli goste na interaktivno sudjelovanje u izložbi putem online kviza, slaganja online puzli, pisanja dojmova u online alatu Awesome Screenshot te odgovaranja na pitanje If Jane came to visit us, what would you teach / show her? u Linoit-a.

Cijeli događaj popratili su lokalni mediji i na taj način podržali učenike u njihovoј kreativnosti i poduzetnosti.



IN BRIEF

She was born in Steventon, Hampshire on 16th December, 1775. Her works made her one of the famous and beloved writers in English literature. Austen's stories are often comic but they also show how women depended on marriage for social standing and economic security and about moral problems. Many films are inspired by her novels.




